

Information on the Processing of Personal Data in the Context of Reporting Wing-Tagged Birds of Prey

(Version 1.0 of 12 January 2025)

With these data protection notices, Bielefeld University fulfils its information obligations pursuant to Articles 13 and 14 of the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) with regard to the above-mentioned processing of personal data.

With respect to further terms used, such as “personal data”, “processing”, “controller”, “third party”, etc., reference is made to the definitions set out in Article 4 GDPR.

2. Processed Personal Data and Purposes

In the context of reporting wing-tagged birds of prey, your personal data are collected and processed for the following purposes:

Storage of your contact details for the purpose of sending sighting histories to you as the reporting person

3. Legal Bases for Data Processing

The collection and storage of your contact details for the purpose of sending sighting histories to you as the reporting person is based on the consent of the data subjects pursuant to Article 6(1)(a) GDPR. The legal basis for the transfer of personal data is Article 6(1)(c) GDPR.

4. Data Transfers

As a rule, your personal data processed by Bielefeld University for the purposes stated under section 2 will not be transferred to third parties. In individual cases, however, data may be transferred to third parties on the basis of a statutory authorization, for example to law enforcement authorities for the investigation of criminal offences in accordance with the provisions of the German Code of Criminal Procedure (StPO).

5. Löschfristen

The data form part of a long-term project and are not subject to any deletion periods.

6. Your Rights as a Data Subject

As a data subject, you may at any time exercise the rights granted to you under the GDPR, including:

- the right to obtain confirmation as to whether and which personal data relating to you are being processed (Article 15 GDPR),
- the right to request the rectification or completion of personal data concerning you (Article 16 GDPR),
- the right to request the erasure of personal data concerning you in accordance with Article 17 GDPR,
- the right to request the restriction of processing in accordance with Article 18 GDPR,
- the right to withdraw consent at any time. The lawfulness of processing carried out on the basis of consent before its withdrawal remains unaffected (Article 7(3) GDPR).

In addition to the rights listed above, you have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority for data protection matters (Article 77 GDPR), for example with the authority responsible for higher education institutions:
