

## **Information on the processing of personal data in connection with registration for the Open Japanese-German Conference on Stochastic Analysis and Applications**

(Version 1.0 dated 5 November 2025)

With this data protection information, Bielefeld University complies with its duty to provide information in accordance with Articles 13 and 14 of the EU General Data Protection Regulation (EU GDPR) for the above-mentioned processing of personal data.

With regard to the other terms used, such as "personal data", "processing", "controller", "third party", etc., reference is made to the definitions in Article 4 of the EU GDPR.

### **2. Processed personal data and purposes**

Within the framework of the Open Japanese-German Conference on Stochastic Analysis and Applications, your personal data will be collected and processed for the following purposes:

The following data is required for the general planning and implementation of the conference:

- Surname, first name
- University/institution
- Email

### 3. Legal basis for data processing

The legal basis for the processing of personal data for the purpose of planning, organising and holding the conference is Art. 6(1)(e) of the EU GDPR.

The processing is carried out within the scope of Bielefeld University's tasks in accordance with Section 3(1) sentences 1 and 2 of the Higher Education Act of North Rhine-Westphalia (HG NRW), according to which universities perform the tasks of research, teaching, promoting young researchers and knowledge and technology transfer.

The collection of personal data for voluntary information (e.g. participation in the conference dinner, indication of dietary preferences or consent to the publication of the name on the website) is based on the consent of the data subjects in accordance with Art. 6 (1) (a) EU GDPR.

The legal basis for the transfer of personal data to third parties (e.g. for the settlement of travel expenses, hotel bookings or grant management) is Art. 6 (1) (c) EU GDPR.

The transfer is necessary to fulfil legal obligations in accordance with the budgetary and travel expense regulations of the state of North Rhine-Westphalia.

### 4. Data transfers

The data collected will be used exclusively for the planning, implementation and follow-up of the conference and for processing funding applications. Data will only be passed on to third parties if this is necessary for the implementation of the event (e.g. hotel reservations or caterers for the conference dinner).

In individual cases, data may be transferred to third parties on the basis of legal permission, for example, transfer to law enforcement authorities for the investigation of criminal offences within the framework of the provisions of the Code of Criminal Procedure (**StPO**).

### 5. Deletion periods

The data will be stored for the duration of the event and its administrative follow-up and then deleted in accordance with the statutory retention periods, but no later than 11 months after collection. If the data is in the form of paper documents, it will be destroyed.

We would like to draw your attention to the fact that when personal data is published on the Internet, it can be accessed by anyone worldwide, including with the support of search engines (e.g. Google). In this way, personality profiles can be created by linking this data with other data about you available on the internet. The data may also be used for other purposes. Archive functions of search engines (see, for example,

www.archive.org) may still allow access to the data even if it has already been removed or changed from the university's websites mentioned above.

## 6. Your rights as a data subject

As a data subject, you can assert your rights under the EU GDPR at any time:

- the right to obtain help desk regarding whether and which data relating to you is being processed (**Art. 15 EU GDPR**),
- the right to request the correction or completion of data concerning you (**Art. 16 EU GDPR**),
- the right to erasure of data concerning you in accordance with **Art. 17 EU GDPR**,
- the right to request restriction of the processing of the data in accordance with **Art. 18 EU GDPR**,

In addition to the above rights, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the data protection supervisory authority (**Art. 77 EU GDPR**), for example with the
