Guidelines for the planned research work

General information: The DAAD requires scholarship holders to submit a detailed work plan, which also forms the basis for applying for additional funding for archive trips and field research outside Germany. The time schedule is an essential part of your proposal and will be reviewed very carefully.

Form of the research work schedule

The work schedule must be written in English or German and must not exceed 1,000 words. Use Arial font in 11pt with 1.5 line spacing for the schedule; tables can be formatted in Arial 9pt.

Please provide the following information in the schedule: Title of the research project.

In order to give an overview of how you plan to structure the dissertation in terms of content as well as time, a tabular timetable is useful. Please indicate single workloads and the time you will need to complete them.

Content of the research work schedule

The work schedule should provide an overview of how you plan to structure the time of your PhD. This must include a detailed plan of phases of research and archive travels. If you plan a field study or a stay abroad, please include a short working plan and schedule of the field trip/stay (when, where, what, how long).

Stays outside Germany within the framework of the DAAD scholarship can only be funded if they are integral parts of the research proposal. No more than 25% of the total funding period can be approved as stays abroad, and a foreign phase cannot take place directly at the beginning of the scholarship.
