Reflecting about Social Justice Education in ELT: Discomfort, Indoctrination and Risk

The awareness that Social Justice Education (SJE) has a role to play in the English language classroom is well established. In reality, however, a number of factors prevent the systematic implementation of such a relevant concept in school practice. These include not only textbook-defined practice in the English classroom, but also systemic structures of standardization and correctness/native speaker orientation. This keynote explores the question of the role of (future) teachers in implementing SJE. I will also use practical teaching ideas to illustrate how teaching for critical discourse competence can be transformative despite the systemic constraints mentioned above.
