Prof. Luciane Corrêa Ferreira — UFMG

Prof. Luciane Corrêa Ferreira is assistant professor at the Federal University of Minas Gerais (UFMG), Faculty of Letters, Post-Graduation Program in Linguistic Studies, Belo Horizonte, Brazil. Prof. Ferreira was a CAPES/FULBRIGHT visiting scholar in the Psychology Department at University of California, Santa Cruz in 2013. She got her Master in Translation Studies at the University of Vienna (1993) and her Ph.D. at the Federal University of Rio Grande do Sul in Brasil (2007). She is co-founder of the NECODI (Nucleus of Cognitive Studies in Discourse) and a member of FULIA (Research group on Football, Language and Arts), both at UFMG, Brazil. In 2014, she was the co-editor of a Special Issue on the Discourse about Soccer of the Journal of the Latin American Discourse Association (ALED). She is also the co-editor of a Special Issue on Metaphor in Social Practices of the Brazilian Journal of Applied Linguistics (2015). Publications include the book chapters “Lernmetapher: eine Studie über die Motivation für das DaF-Lernen” (2014), “Metáfora e empatia no discurso de vítimas de violência em centros urbanos brasileiros” (co-author, 2012) and “Do People infer the Eintailments of Conceptual Metaphors during Verbal Metaphor Understanding?” (with Prof. Raymond Gibbs, 2011). She has also recently published the articles following journal articles: “O discurso sobre futebol e violência em Minas Gerais (2014) and Futebol e metáfora na mídia” (2014).
