## **Paid PhD position**

#### **General conditions**

- usually fixed-term contract
- usually part-time (50-75%)
- salary according to collective wage agreement, pay scale level TVL-13
- Social insurances are covered (health care, unemployment benefits, pension)

Law on fixed-term contracts in research (WissZeitVG = Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz) 6 years before PhD + 6 years after PhD





### Paid PhD position at a university

#### **Research assistant (wissenschaftliche\*r Mitarbeiter\*in)**

working on a project or at the faculty with a professor and his/her working group, often teaching duties. Employment in a research project or at a professor's chair. In addition to tasks related to your own doctorate: cooperation with the Working Group, teaching duties.

It is important to distinguish between budget-financed and third-party financed positions. Conditions vary on the financial background (third Party funded or not)

+ good insights - possibly time-consuming

#### Member of a research training group (Graduiertenkolleg)

qualification and exchange programme (workshops, colloquia, retreats), regular reports on progress

+ network, career development - time-pressure



# Paid PhD position at a non-university institute

Fraunhofer-Gesellschaft

Helmholtz-Gemeinschaft

Leibniz-Gemeinschaft

Max-Planck-Gesellschaft

cooperative PhD = collaboration with university

+ high reputation, integration into networks

- very competitive, little knowledge of university structures







### Paid PhD position in the industry

Industry-related and application-oriented research with prospect of further employment, research as part of job description, topic is pre-defined by company

cooperative PhD = collaboration with university

- Job experiences, entry into research and development departments of companies
- little knowledge of university, little integration into scientific networks


Outstanding academic achievements + longlasting social commitment



## Foundations for specific topics or disciplines

#### Deutsche Bundesstiftung Umwelt (DBU)

- funds 60 scholarships/year, research from all disciplines that focuses on environment and nature conservation
- Requirements: above average degree, coherent and interesting CV
- Duration: 36 months, 1.500€ monthly payment, 210€ research lump sum
- Deadlines: 15.01. und 15.06.

### **GERDA HENKEL STIFTUNG**


- funds research in the Historical Sciences
- Requirements: above average degree, applicant must not be older than 28 years at the time of their graduation
- Duration: 24 months, 1.600€ monthly payment, plus family allowance, material and travel costs if necessary
- Deadline: anytime

### **Bielefeld Young Researchers' Fund**

#### Funding lines for doctoral students:

- Career Bridge Master-Doctorate: establish the idea for a doctorate, secure long-term funding, 1.000€/month for 6 months
- Doctorate Completion Scholarship: finish your PhD, 1.250 €/month for 6 months

#### **Funding lines for postdocs:**

- Research Subsidies/Promotion of Mobility: max. 5.000€
- Entry into third-party funded research: max. 15.000€
- Career Bridge Doctorate Postdoc: apply for third-party funding, 2.000€/month for 12 months
