Your Tasks

In the framework of the Research Training Group (RTG) "Experiencing Gender. Constitution and Transformation of Being in the World" funded by Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (DFG), one postdoc position will be awarded to a candidate. The maximal time of funding for the position is 4,5 years. The position will start on May 1, 2021. Participating disciplines are: (Inter)American Studies, Gender Studies, Public Health, German Literature, Political Science, Sociology, and Sports Science.

Research tasks include:

- to conduct an interdisciplinary research project focusing on the experience of gender, the material aspect of this
 experience as well as its significance in the constitution of gendered modes of being (Existenzweisen) and/or in the
 transformation of the gender order (60 %)
- to complete a monograph or several journal articles and/or book chapters (20 %)
- to participate actively in the RTG's academic program and to help shape its content (15 %)
- to participate in the RTG's managing board and in the selection process of the second cohort of PhD candidates (5 %)

The successful candidate will be offered the opportunity to habilitate in a renowned interdisciplinary research environment. The RTG draws on long-standing experience in and institutional structures of Gender Studies as well as existing structured PhD programs at Bielefeld university. In addition to employment, the postdoc will have access to funding for workshops, travel (conferences), and research stays in Germany and abroad.

Remuneration

Salary will be paid according to Remuneration level 13 of the Wage Agreement for Public Service in the Federal States (TV-L). As stipulated in § 2 (1) sentence 2 of the WissZeitVG (fixed-term employment), the contract will end on 31th of October 2025. In accordance with the provisions of the WissZeitVG and the Agreement on Satisfactory Conditions of Employment, the length of contract may differ in individual cases. The employment is designed to encourage further academic qualification. In principle, this full-time position may be changed into a part-time position, as long as this does not conflict with official needs.
